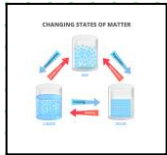

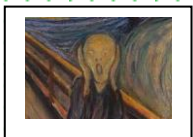

History – Stone Age to Iron Age

Stone Age revolves around the reveal of an object found at Star Carr in Yorkshire which dates from the Middle Stone Age. It is generally regarded as the most important and informative Mesolithic site in Great Britain.

How much did life change when man learned how to...

To learn of the major changes that came in the Neolithic period with the arrival of farming from the Near East. After a brief introduction, pupils are asked to look at 9 features of life in the New Stone Age and which mark continuity from the Middle Stone Age (Mesolithic period).

What can be learn from Skara Brae?

Skara Brae, one of the most preserved Stone Age villages which was covered for hundreds of years by a sand dune on the shore of the Bay of Skall, Mainland, Orkney Islands, Scotland. Exposed by a great storm in 1850, four buildings were excavated during the 1860s by William Watt.

Why did they build Stonehenge?

Stonehenge is perhaps the world's most famous prehistoric monument. It was built in several stages: the first henge monument, built about 5,000 years ago, and the unique stone circle was erected in the late Neolithic period about 2500 BC.
